RESEARCH PROJECTS

Current Projects:

- Book project *Inhabiting the Transit: Migrant Spatial Struggles from Global South America to the U.S.* (2025-26)

This book examines the transnational journeys of 14 forcibly displaced migrants from Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, and the Andes, as they navigate both physically and digitally through South American countries and traverse the Andean Region-Central American migratory corridor en route to the U.S. Their mobility is an ongoing experience of inhabiting transit, shaped by violence, uneven development, and exclusionary border regimes. Trapped in

perpetual motion, they resist through spatial and digital strategies, where digital space becomes a lifeline. However, they face precarious circumstances that force them to navigate unequal access, oscillating between digital connection and disconnection—a central dynamic in their social and digital struggles, and the core focus of this project. Drawing on multi-sited and digital ethnography, historical research, and a migrant-centered approach, the book reconstructs the journeys of migrants from Syria, Iraq, Nigeria, Sudan, Zimbabwe, Haiti, Cuba, Colombia, and Venezuela, whom I met between 2016 and 2023 in Quito, Metetí, and Houston. The fieldwork investigates their initial transits to Ecuador, Brazil, and Colombia, how their lives unfolded there, and what provoked their subsequent northward journeys to the U.S. It explores how these migrants understood and lived their transit trajectories physically and digitally, deploying social, economic, material, and digital strategies of survival in a relentless spatial struggle to stay alive. The manuscript's eight chapters present the central argument, outline my digital and in-person encounters with the migrants, reconstruct the history of transit migration across the Andean Region Central American corridor, and follow their journeys as they leave their countries of origin, digitally select destinations, navigate mobility infrastructures, attempt to insert themselves in hostile spaces, and ultimately restart their transits north via complex routes. Adopting the *autonomy of migration thesis*, this book contributes to the understanding of migrant struggles, particularly those of forcibly displaced people from Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, and the Andes, and the pivotal role that digital space and (dis)connection play in these struggles.

- *Mobilities, Control and Spatial Struggles across the Americas in a (post) pandemic context* in collaboration with CAMINAR-Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (2024-26)

Based upon the findings of the digital transnational trilingual project [*\(Im\)mobility in the Americas and COVID-19*](#), which compares the dynamics of mobility and control across 19 countries (Canada, the United States, Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Honduras, Costa Rica, Panama, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Chile, Argentina, Bolivia and Brazil) this collaborative project continues to deepen how the pandemic has brought 1) spatial and temporal interconnections between northbound and southbound migratory corridors across the Americas; 2) the aftermaths of the devastation of migrants' living conditions and the exacerbation of undocumented transits through both corridors; 3) regional socioeconomic and political pressure that these transits place on societies and States along both migratory corridors; 4) new ways in which the U.S. externalizes its borders across the Americas; 5) reinforcement of the heterogeneous Latin American migratory control regime and its damaging effects on the migrant population; and 6) forms of migrant resistance and survival during crossing and waiting times in a highly hostile, racist and xenophobic environment.

Following the shutdown of borders across the Americas, more than 45 researchers – from diverse disciplinary social sciences and humanities backgrounds and affiliated to various universities and research centers from North, Central and South America and the Caribbean—, organized virtually to gather mainly press information about the particular situations of millions of regional and extracontinental undocumented migrants and asylum seekers currently residing in or transiting across the continent. Based on the collected data, the research team created an online digital repository which resulted in the online web archive: [*\(Im\)mobility in the Americas and COVID-19*](#) (www.inmovilidadesamericas.org). As of July 2021, the web-page is trilingual (English/Spanish/Portuguese) and gives an account of the situation in the following 19 countries: Canada, the United States, Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua,

Honduras, Costa Rica, Panama, Haiti, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Chile, Argentina, Bolivia and Brazil.

Together with Dr. Ulla Berg, Associate Professor of Latino & Caribbean Studies and Anthropology, Rutgers University, we have been granted a \$10,800 fund from *Rutgers Global* (2020-2021) to develop the project's virtual platform and virtual teaching modules to be taught in Spring 2021.
